



## **Sussex Community Foundation General Awards**

### **Funds open in Round 3 2017/18 Deadline 5pm, Friday 12<sup>th</sup> January**

*For your information, here is a list of the funds that will be open in Round 3 2017/18, and the areas that the donors in each case are interested in supporting. Please check our website for further information about applying and new funds available.*

*For the most part, you DO NOT need to apply to a particular fund – please put your application on our general application form, available at [www.sussexgiving.org.uk/apply](http://www.sussexgiving.org.uk/apply). We will put your application to the fund we think most likely to fund your application. However, some funds do have their own criteria and/or application forms, as noted below – please see our website for these.*

**Brenda Ford Fund** Supports Charities and community groups in Sussex involved in advice, support and services to women suffering from or at risk of domestic abuse. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Brighton & Hove Arts Fund** Supports small charities and community groups involved in the arts in Brighton & Hove. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Brighton and Hove Legacy Fund** The fund will award grants to not for profit organisations which support the educational and personal development of children and young people of Brighton & Hove. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Carpenter Box** Supports small, local voluntary and community groups and organisations that are active in West Sussex and that are providing services within two broad charitable themes. This year the themes are 'Youth in the Community' and 'The Elderly.'" Grants of up to £1,500. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Cragwood Fund – large grant programme** Supporting charities and community groups of all sizes which support homeless and/or vulnerably housed people in West Sussex, especially new or extended programmes of work in: preparing for work and the cultivation of skills for employment; training and support around money, health and well-being and the practical skills associated with independent living; social reintegration and resilience in preparation for independent living. One grant of up to £20,000 per year for a period of three years.

Separate guidance but please apply using the standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Cragwood Fund – small grants** Supports charities and community groups addressing disadvantage, with a focus on older people and a preference for those working in West Sussex. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Cullum Family Trust Fund** Supports charities and groups operating between Brighton and Worthing and addressing homelessness or supporting children or older people. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Dexam Fund** Supports charitable organisations operating in West Sussex, particularly in the Midhurst and Petworth areas. Groups can include those working with issues around young people, elderly people, and needs in rural areas including environmental and countryside schemes. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Field Family Fund** Awards grants to small charities and community groups promoting good citizenship amongst young people in Sussex; providing support and activities for older people, to enable them to live life to the fullest; or involved in end of life care and bereavement support. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Gatwick Foundation Fund** Supports charities and community groups in Horsham, Mid Sussex, Crawley and Wealden districts with projects helping people to gain confidence and raise aspirations through training and development of new skills; addressing social isolation and disadvantage experienced by families, children and older people; helping young people widen their horizons and aspirations. Grants of up to £10,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Glenn & Phyllida Earle Fund** Supports groups in north East Sussex (particularly around Wadhurst) helping young people achieve their potential, or, promoting support of vulnerable people. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Ian Askew Charitable Trust** Supports charities and not-for-profit organisations across Sussex working in the following areas: education; health; welfare of children; housing needs; job creation and sustainability; mental health; substance misuse. Grants of up to £1,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Innes Fund** Grants to charities supporting disadvantaged people and promoting well-being in West Sussex. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**John Laing Charitable Trust** Grants for charities and community groups in West Sussex which support homelessness, disadvantaged and exploited young people with a preference for prevention and early intervention, education (for those aged 3-18), and community

regeneration including charities benefitting the aged. Grants of up to £1,000, and the organisation should have a turnover of less than £300,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Kim Addison Fund** Grants are to help disadvantaged children, for example by running activities or holidays they might otherwise be unable to afford. Small charities and community groups supporting good citizenship amongst young people in Sussex; providing support and activities for older people, to enable them to live life to the full; or involved in end of life care and bereavement support. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Knighton Fund** Grants for charities and not-for-profit organisations across Sussex which support children and young people, with a particular focus on the those in the Mid Sussex area. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Lawson Fund** The Lawson Endowment supports charities and community groups in Sussex (particularly in the north of East Sussex), including those working in the following areas: older people; health issues; children and young people; assistance for the disabled or disadvantaged; arts and culture. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Leyden House Fund** Supports small community groups and charities in Sussex providing support and services for people with a disability. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Lisbet Rausing & Peter Baldwin End of Life Care Fund** Supports charities and community groups which help people who are terminally ill or their carers and whose turnover is less than £1m per year. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Little Cheyne Court Wind Farm Fund** Supports Sussex charities and community groups who operate within ten kilometres of the wind farm which lies seven miles west of Lydd on Romney Marsh. Grants of between £500 and £5,000 support environmental, educational, community and charitable activities. This fund has its own guidance and application form. Deadline: Friday 16th February.

**Lorna's Fund** Supports smaller charities and community groups working to address disadvantage in Bognor Regis and the surrounding area, including homelessness, mental health, domestic abuse, drug and alcohol problems or support for children or young people to reach their potential. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Margaret Greenhough Fund** Grants to not for profit organisations which promote music in Sussex. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Millicent Mather Fund** Supports small charities and community groups in West Sussex, particularly those involved in education and the arts. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**The Rampion Fund** supports projects that benefit the broad community, in particular those with links to environment and ecology, climate change and energy, and improved community facilities. Grants of up to £10,000 and capital awards of up to £50,000. This fund has its own guidance and application form.

**Rooney Foundation Fund** Grants for children with life limiting illnesses; both individuals and groups working with children with disabilities or with special needs in Sussex may apply. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**Westdene Fund** Supports individual young people (16-25 years) in Sussex with outstanding musical talent. Grants of up to £800. Separate guidance and application form.

**William Alexander Fund** Gives grants to groups in Brighton & Hove who support: disadvantaged children & young people, the elderly, refugees & asylum seekers, those who suffer from drug & alcohol misuse or people suffering with mental health issues. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

**William Reed Fund** Grants to local or national organisations supporting social welfare projects operating and benefiting people in the Crawley area. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.
