

The Cragwood Fund Large Grants Programme

Criteria and guidance notes.

The Cragwood Fund at Sussex Community Foundation seeks to fund charities and community groups which support homeless and/or vulnerably housed people in West Sussex.

The Fund is particularly interested in supporting organisations developing new or extended programmes of work in the following areas:

- Preparing for work and the cultivation of skills for employment
- Training and support around money, health and well-being and the practical skills associated with independent living
- Social reintegration and resilience in preparation for independent living.

Projects must be able to track and demonstrate the impact of the work proposed.

What can you apply for?

One grant of up to £20,000 per year for a period of three years is available. The grant will be allocated on an annual basis for three years subject to satisfactory end of year monitoring reports. The grant may cover both project specific and organisational running costs. Priority will be given to projects/programmes with other sources of funding, ie. that will not be solely reliant on the Cragwood Fund.

Who can apply?

The fund is open to charities and community groups of all sizes working to support homeless and/or vulnerably housed people in West Sussex.

How to apply

If your project meets these criteria you should complete and submit our standard SCF Application Form, available at www.sussexgiving.org.uk. Please note that you may apply for this funding alongside another application to SCF or in addition to funding you may have received from SCF in the past year.

The deadline for completed applications and supporting documents is **5pm, Friday 13th September 2019**.

Applicants may then be contacted to arrange a visit. Applications will subsequently be presented to panel and you will be informed of the outcome by the end of November.
