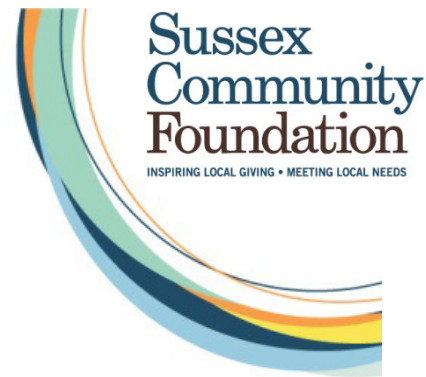

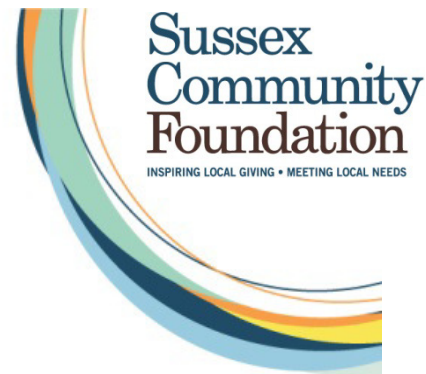

<p>#iwill Fund Supports charities and community groups to engage young people in campaigning, volunteering, fundraising as part of a drive to encourage youth social action. This is part of the iwill campaign, funded by Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport, and the Big Lottery Fund who each invested £20 million to transform the culture of community engagement by getting young people involved in greater volunteering opportunities. Grants of £1,000 - £5,000. This fund has its own criteria and application form.</p>
<p>Aisbitt Family Fund Supports small charities and community groups across Sussex addressing disadvantage with an emphasis on preventative work. Grants of £1,000 - £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.</p>
<p>Alta Fund Supports charities and community groups in Sussex (excluding Brighton & Hove) which support young people; promote education and achievement; help children who are disadvantaged; use the arts to support disadvantaged people. Preference is for the areas around Uckfield, East Grinstead and Lewes. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.</p>
<p>American Express Fund Supports charities working in Brighton & Hove and Burgess Hill, addressing one or more of the following: developing leadership in the non-profit sector; promoting volunteering and community engagement (including opportunities for AMEX employees); helping disadvantaged people into work; promoting diversity, social inclusion and equal rights, targeting groups such as Black and minority ethnic communities, women, Lesbian Gay Bisexual and Transgender communities and Hispanic communities. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.</p>
<p>Anjoli Stewart Fund Supports smaller charities and community groups working in Hastings and the surrounding area, addressing disadvantage and helping people who have few choices in life to address their own problems and achieve their potential. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.</p>
<p>Arthur & Doreen Green Fund Supports small community groups and charities in Sussex, including hospices, young people and the elderly. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.</p>

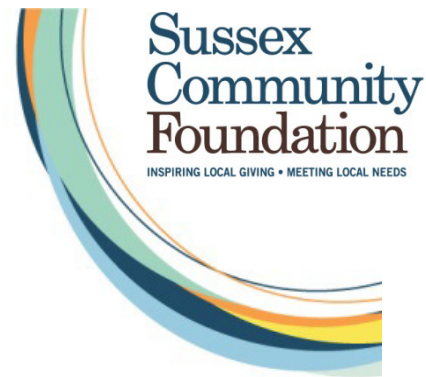

Beechlands Fund Supports young people and those in education with grants to provide a springboard to successful careers and rewarding lives. Sussex-wide but preference for projects near Lewes, including Brighton & Hove. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.
Boltini Fund Supports community groups and charities addressing disadvantage in West Sussex, in particular the needs of children and young people, people with chronic illness and with disabilities, and people who are homeless. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.
Brenda Ford Fund Grants to support community grassroots groups and charities working in Sussex, offering advice, support and services to women at risk of, or in situations of, domestic abuse. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.
Brighton Rock Fund Supports charities and community groups in Sussex working to benefit the environment, including addressing climate change; and work with older people. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.
Carpenter Box Fund To support small, local voluntary and community groups and organisations that are active in West Sussex and that are providing services within two broad charitable themes. This year these are youth in the community and older people. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.
Cragwood Fund Supports charities and community groups addressing disadvantage, with a focus on older people and a preference for those working in West Sussex. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.
Cullum Family Trust Fund Grants to charities and community groups operating in Brighton & Hove and West Sussex and working with issues around homelessness; supporting children, older people, and people with learning disabilities. 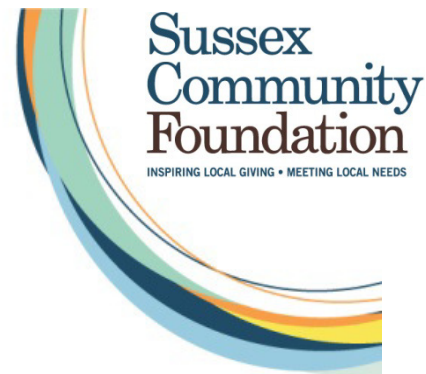

Fleming Family Fund Supports small groups and charities working with children and older people across Sussex, especially those with disabilities. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.
Frank and Lorna's Fund Supports smaller charities and community groups working to address disadvantage in Bognor Regis and the surrounding area, including homelessness, mental health, domestic abuse, drug and alcohol problems or support for children or young people to reach their potential. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.
Gatwick Foundation Fund Grants to charities and community groups in Horsham, Mid Sussex, Crawley and Wealden districts with projects helping people to gain confidence and raise aspirations through training and development of new skills; addressing social isolation and disadvantage experienced by families, children and older people; helping young people widen their horizons and aspirations. Grants of up to £10,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

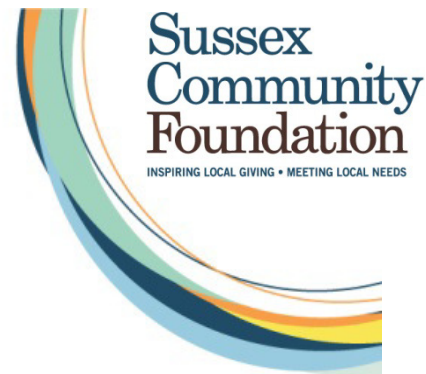

Lawson Fund See below The Lawson Endowment supports charities and community groups in Sussex (particularly in the north of East Sussex), including those working in the following areas: older people; health issues; children and young people; assistance for the disabled or disadvantaged; arts and culture. Grants of up to £5,000 are made. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.
Lewes Fund Supports small local charities and community groups in Lewes area addressing disadvantage. Grants of up to £1,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.
Lisbet Rausing & Peter Baldwin End of Life Care Fund Grants to charities and community groups across Sussex providing end-of-life care and supporting people affected by terminal illness. Applicants must have a turnover of less than £1 million per annum. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.
Little Cheyne Court Wind Farm Fund Grants to charities and community groups based within a 10-kilometre radius of the wind farm, and undertaking environmental, educational, community and charitable activities. Supports Sussex charities and community groups who operate within ten kms of the wind farm which lies seven miles west of Lydd on Romney Marsh. Grants of between £500 and £5,000 support environmental, educational, community and charitable activities. This fund has its own guidance and online application form.
Marit & Hans Rausing Fund Charities/groups across Sussex addressing the root causes of disadvantage. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.
Open Door Fund Supports charities which support homeless and vulnerably housed people in West Sussex, specifically in the area of financial literacy. Preventative work will be viewed favourably and evidence of partnership working is welcomed. The Fund is keen to support creative approaches to supporting homeless and vulnerably housed people who are on low budgets or in financial hardship or in debt, or who have difficulty managing their finances. One grant of £10,000 per year for up to three years is available. This Fund has its own application form.

Purple Fund To awards grants to charities and not-for-profit organisations in West Sussex which either • reduce social isolation among older people or people with mental health problems (fun and quirky projects are particularly encouraged) • use contact with cats or other animals in a therapeutic way • operate animal sanctuaries or provide veterinary care or treatment, to cat owners who cannot otherwise afford such treatment; Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.
Rampion Fund Grants to support organisations working for the benefit of the people of Sussex from Littlehampton Harbour in the west, to Beachy Head in the east and up to the A272 near Twineham in the north close to the wind farm's onshore substation. Supports projects that benefit the broad community, in particular those with links to environment and ecology, climate change and energy, and improved community facilities. Grants of up to £50,000. This fund has its own criteria and application form.
Rooney Foundation Fund Grants to grassroots charities and community groups in Sussex working with, and supporting, children with special needs and their families. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.
Rye Fund Supports charities and community groups operating in Rye and surrounding villages within a 9-kilometre radius. Grants of up to £1,500. This Fund has its own criteria and application form.
William Alexander Fund Supports groups in Brighton & Hove who give support to: disadvantaged children & young people, the elderly, refugees & asylum seekers, those who suffer from drug & alcohol misuse or people suffering with mental health issues. Standard SCF application form
