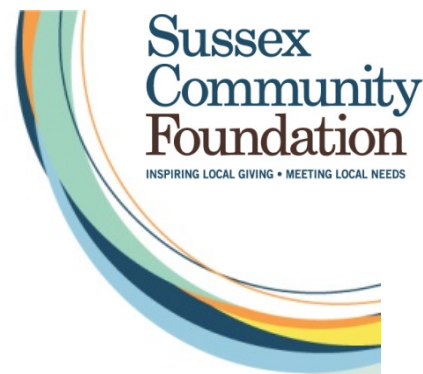


Fund Directory



Funds open in Summer Round 2019/20

Deadline 5pm, Friday 3rd May 2019

For your information, here is a list of the funds that will be open in our Summer Round 2019/20, and the areas that the donors in each case are interested in supporting. Please check our website for further information about applying and new funds available.

For the most part, you DO NOT need to apply to a particular fund – please put your application on our general application form, available at www.sussexgiving.org.uk/apply. We will put your application to the fund we think most likely to fund your application. However, some funds do have their own criteria and/or application forms, as noted below – please see our website for these.

Albert Van den Bergh / Glover Fund Supports charities and not-for-profit organisations, operating within Sussex, with a particular focus on groups that support mental health issues. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Alex and William De Winton Trust Fund Small charities and community groups across Sussex addressing disadvantage with an emphasis on smaller and grass roots organisations. Grants of £1,000 - £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Alta Fund Supports charities and community groups in Sussex (excluding Brighton & Hove) which support young people; promote education and achievement; help children who are disadvantaged; use the arts to support disadvantaged people. Preference is for the areas around Uckfield, East Grinstead and Lewes. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Azalea Fund Small charities and community groups across Sussex addressing disadvantage. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Brenda Ford Fund Grants to support community grassroots groups and charities working in Sussex, offering advice, support and services to women at risk of, or in situations of, domestic abuse. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Cragwood Fund Supports charities and community groups addressing disadvantage, with a focus on older people and a preference for those working in West Sussex. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Cullum Family Trust Fund Grants to charities and community groups operating in Brighton & Hove and West Sussex and working with issues around homelessness; supporting children, older people, and people with learning disabilities. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Dame Elizabeth Nash Fund Grants to small charities and community groups supporting those in need in rural West Sussex, particularly the parishes of Walberton, Bury, Boxgrove and Bosham. Grants of up to £2,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Dexam Fund Supports charitable organisations operating in West Sussex, particularly in the Midhurst and Petworth areas. Groups can include those working with issues around young people, elderly people, and needs in rural areas including environmental and countryside schemes. Grants of up to

£5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form

East Brighton Trust Fund Grants of up to £500 are available to not-for-profit organisations including charities, community and voluntary groups undertaking projects or events in East Brighton.

Fairfield Fund Grants to support groups working across East Sussex and Brighton & Hove, particularly in the Hastings and Rother districts. Groups can include those working in the following areas: children & young people; assistance for the disabled or learning disabled; literacy & language and those working to address disadvantage. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Gatwick Foundation Fund Grants to charities and community groups in Horsham, Mid Sussex, Crawley and Wealden districts with projects helping people to gain confidence and raise aspirations through training and development of new skills; addressing social isolation and disadvantage experienced by families, children and older people; helping young people widen their horizons and aspirations. Grants of up to £10,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Glenn & Phyllida Earle Fund Supports groups around the Wadhurst area which involve volunteers to support vulnerable people or help young people achieve their potential. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Gurney Charitable Trust Fund Grants to smaller charities and community groups in Sussex which address a range of charitable causes including health and medical issues, disability and disadvantage, natural history and the arts. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form

Ian Askew Charitable Trust Fund Supporting charities and not-for-profit organisations across Sussex working in the following areas: education; health; welfare of children; housing needs; job creation and sustainability; mental health; substance misuse. Grants of up to £1,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Innes Fund Supports disadvantaged people and promoting well-being in West Sussex. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Isaac Ganas Fund Supports charities and community groups addressing disadvantage across Sussex, with preference with Brighton & Hove. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Lawson Fund The Lawson Endowment supports charities and community groups in Sussex (particularly in the north of East Sussex), including those working in the following areas: older people; health issues; children and young people; assistance for the disabled or disadvantaged; arts and culture. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Lisbet Rausing & Peter Baldwin End of Life Care Fund Grants to charities and community groups across Sussex providing end-of-life care and supporting people affected by terminal illness. Applicants must have a turnover of less than £1 million per annum. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Lorna's Fund Supports smaller charities and community groups working to address disadvantage in Bognor Regis and the surrounding area, including homelessness, mental health, domestic abuse, drug and alcohol problems or support for children or young people to reach their potential. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Marit And Hans Rausing Fund Charities/groups across Sussex addressing the root causes of disadvantage. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Meads Fund The aim of this fund is to give grants to charities and community groups located or operating in Eastbourne, Sussex. Groups should actively promote the inclusion of all members of the community. Grants of up to £20,000 for up to three years. This fund has its own criteria and application form.

Nick & Gill Wills Fund Grants to charities and community groups in Sussex supporting women who are vulnerable or at risk of abuse, exploitation or violence; promoting women's rights or equality between men and women. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Nino Fund The Nino Fund supports charities and not-for-profit organisations in Sussex including those working to benefit the environment and promote environmental sustainability; reduce waste and energy use; promote healthy and the outdoors; nature conservation. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Price Family Fund Grants to charities and community groups in Mid Sussex supporting children and young people. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Purple Fund Supports charities and not-for-profit organisations which either reduce social isolation among older people or people with mental health problems, uses contact with cats or other animals in a therapeutic way, operate animal sanctuaries or provide veterinary care or treatment, to cat owners who cannot otherwise afford such treatment. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Rampion Fund Grants to support organisations working for the benefit of the people of Sussex from Littlehampton Harbour in the west, to Beachy Head in the east and up to the A272 near Twineham in the north close to the wind farm's onshore substation. Supports projects that benefit the broad community, in particular those with links to environment and ecology, climate change and energy, and improved community facilities. Grants of up to £50,000. This fund has its own criteria and application form. Please check application deadlines on our website.

Rooney Foundation Fund Grants to grassroots charities and community groups in Sussex working with, and supporting, children with special needs and their families. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Sachs Trust Fund Grants to charities and community groups in Lewes and within a ten-mile radius of the town. Grants of up to £1,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Selits Fund Supports projects within Brighton & Hove which address homelessness or help provide better opportunities for disadvantaged children and young people. Grants of up to £1,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Sierra Gorda Fund Supports small community groups and charities that address disadvantage and build stronger communities, or those working in the arts. It supports organisations working in East Sussex with a preference for those in Hastings, St Leonards and Rother district. Grants of up to £1,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation Application Form.

Westdene Fund Supports individual young people (16-25 years) in Sussex with outstanding musical talent. Grants of up to £1000. Separate guidance and application form.

Westoute Fund To support a range of charitable causes with an emphasis on preventative work to minimise disadvantage. Priority issues include drug & alcohol addiction, offending, mental health, young people and homelessness. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

William Alexander Fund Supports groups in Brighton & Hove who give support to: disadvantaged children & young people, the elderly, refugees & asylum seekers, those who suffer from drug & alcohol misuse or people suffering with mental health issues. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

William Reed Fund Grants to local or national organisations supporting social welfare projects operating and benefiting people in the Crawley area. Grants of up to £5,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.

Worthing & Adur Fund Grants to small charities and community groups working in Worthing & Adur. Grants up to £1,000. Standard Sussex Community Foundation application form.
