Commentary

Within Sussex, the highest number and rates of homelessness occur in Crawley, Brighton & Hove and Hastings. The figure for Worthing is suppressed as the figure is lower than 5. Since the last report, homelessness figures have fluctuated across the districts with some areas seeing reductions in homelessness (Brighton & Hove, Horsham) and others increases (e.g. Crawley, Arun and Wealden).
