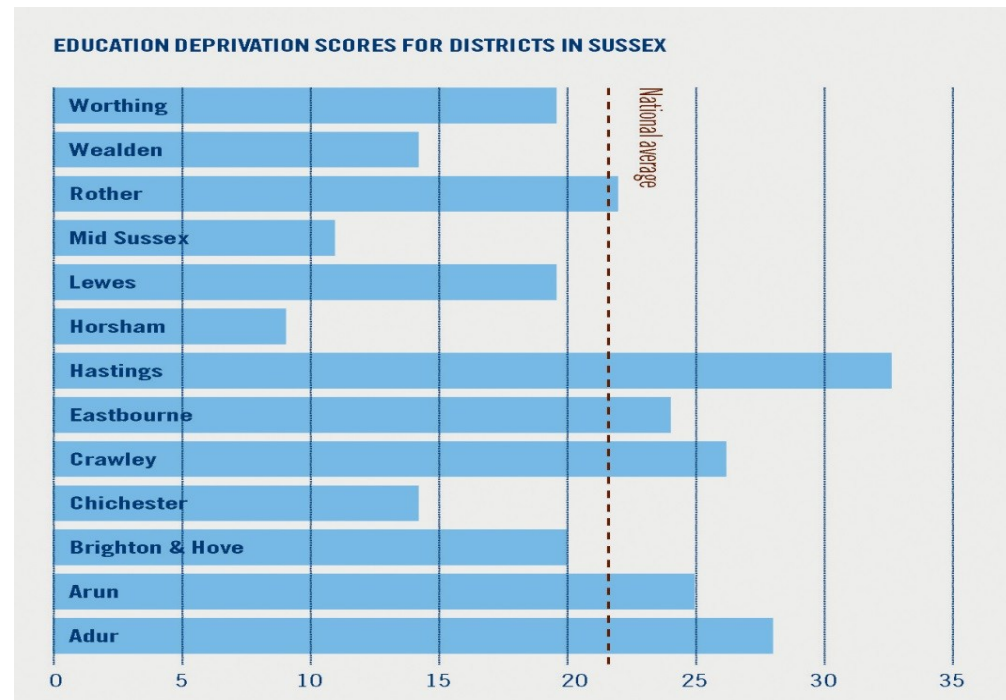

Commentary

The Education, Skills and Training Deprivation Domain considers the lack of attainment and skills in the local population, through from children and young people up to adults. Sussex is more deprived than average on the education deprivation index. The bar chart shows the education deprivation scores for districts in Sussex, with the red dotted line indicating the national average. Six districts within Sussex have levels of education deprivation above the national average, with Hastings recording the highest overall (32.66%). In the last report, only four districts had education deprivation scores above the national average, indicating that some of the districts in Sussex have become more deprived on this domain relative to other areas.
