### **Commentary**

The table here lists the wards in the 20% most deprived (by average IMD) in each district across Sussex. There are 7,679 wards in England so to be ranked in the top 20% most deprived, a ward must rank 1,586 or less.

Wards in the top 10% (ranking 768 or less) are marked in bold.

There are 14 wards in Sussex in the 10% most deprived in England and 26 in the 20% most deprived. In the previous IMD, there were 34 wards in the top 20%, which indicates that the extent of ward level deprivation in Sussex has reduced relative to other areas.

However, in the last IMD, Crawley had no wards in the top 20% but this time round Broadfield South has crept in to the top 20% most deprived.

This may indicate that although overall deprivation has decreased, some small areas have been more adversely affected.
